Johann Conrad Rudolph Wohlien (* 1808 in Altona; † 29. November 1866 ebenda) was an organ builder in Altona.

He belonged to the well-known organ builder family Wohlien of Altona and was "the third organ builder of his lineage." Wohlien died during the renovation of the organ at St. Trinitatis in Hamburg-Altona. With his son Johann Friedrich Eduard Wohlien (1843–1871), the company founded by his grandfather Balthasar Wohlien came to an end.

Description

Historical instrument from the 19th century; oldest parts by Johann Conrad Wohlin (organ builder in Altona) dating back to 1856; expanded by the Danish firm Marcussen.

In 2020, thoroughly restored and revised by Babel company (Gettorf); reconstruction of a reed stop in the manual is still pending.

Beautiful closed romantic tone.
