Description

The organ in Bygdsiljum Church, constructed by Grönlunds Orgelbyggeri AB between 1979 and 1980, exemplifies the builder's craftsmanship and the typical design of small organs from that period. Both the tracker action and stop action are fully mechanical, providing the organist with precise control over the instrument's attack and release phases.

Although the building housing the organ was inaugurated in 1924, it was not officially designated as a church until 1959 when ownership was transferred to the Burträsk congregation. This transition marked the chapel's elevation to a church status, eventually leading to the installation of the notable Grönlunds organ.
