Description

The beautiful baroque St. Nikolai Church in the village of Hohenfelde houses a historic Marcussen organ from 1890, which has remained virtually unchanged and boasts a rich palette of fundamental tonal colors. All efforts in the sixties to transform this instrument in the taste of the time into neo-Baroque (as happened, for example, in St. Dionysius Süderau or St. Michaelis Hohenaspe) failed fortunately, from today's perspective.

The instrument is currently in need of significant renovation, but in its integrity, it remains a remarkable example of North German organ building in the Romantic era.
